Guidance for Board Members

- Oversight Board members cannot play a role in the decision-making process for state-level reinvestment, but may participate in recommendations for local grants.
 - Final decision-making authority rests with GOCCP as the grant administrator.
- Representatives from local jurisdictions may participate in recommending local grants, and may stay on the Board even if their county or agency receives a grant.
 - Members whose entities apply may be asked by GOCCP to abstain for participating in grants from that category
 - All Board members will be asked to follow GOCCP grant review protocol for stating conflicts of interest.



Local Reinvestment Priorities

Year 1

- Reentry Programs
- Evidence-Based Practices and Policies
- Pre-trial Risk Assessments & Validation
- Specialty Courts
- Victim Services and Rights

Year 2

- Services to Reduce Pre-trial Detention
- Recidivism-Reduction Programming
- Substance Use Disorder and Community Mental Health Services
- Diversion and Deflection Programs
- Victim Services and Rights

Eligible Entities

- County-level agencies
- Non-profits operating within a target jurisdiction

Limitations

- No more than one grant per county
- New programs
- Competitive application process

- Reentry
- Treatment
- Restitution Collection
- Training for Criminal Justice Decision Makers

Eligible Entities

- Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services
- Maryland Department of Health
- Other agencies fulfilling JRCC recommendations

Limitations

- Competitive and noncompetitive whitepaper funding opportunities
