CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER SERVICES PROGRAM REPORT

Child Advocacy Centers provide a coordinated, multidisciplinary approach to the problem of child abuse. Child Advocacy Centers are safe, child-friendly environments for forensic interviews and medical evaluations for the alleged child victim and offer continued support to the child and non-offending family members. Programs provide services to children, and their families, who are victims of severe physical and sexual abuse and neglect. Child Advocacy Centers also help reduce existing gaps in services and foster collaboration among partner agencies and stakeholders throughout Maryland. Child Advocacy Centers promote and provide specialized training for professionals, and extend efforts to promote public awareness and prevention.

Section 11-923(h) of the Criminal Procedure Article requires the Governor's Office of Crime Control & Prevention to establish and sustain Child Advocacy Centers and states the following purposes of these centers:

“ (2) The child advocacy centers:

(i) may be based in private nonprofit organizations, local departments of social services, local law enforcement agencies, or a partnership among any of these entities;

(ii) shall be developed and located to facilitate their use by alleged victims residing in the surrounding areas;

(iii) shall investigate allegations of sexual crimes against children and sexual abuse of minors;

(iv) shall provide or facilitate referrals to appropriate counseling, legal, medical, and advocacy services for victims; and

(v) shall be included in all joint investigation procedures developed in accordance with § 5-706 of the Family Law Article.”

Child Advocacy Center's program funds go to help reduce existing gaps in services, foster collaboration and increase cooperation among partnering agencies and stakeholders throughout Maryland through salaries, operating expenses, specialized equipment and trainings. Skilled staff cares for child victims of trauma and their families. Following an interview, a child is assisted by a designated case manager or advocate while rejoining his or her parent or guardian. Team case reviews and coordination are conducted on a regular basis to assure best possible outcomes for the child and family.

One type of trauma in children is poly-victimization, also known as complex trauma, which describes the experience of multiple victimizations of different types. Research shows that the impact of poly-victimization is much more powerful than even multiple events of a single type of victimization. Child Advocacy Centers now have the training and resources to properly equip child maltreatment practitioners with the skills they need to assess and assist poly-victims,

provide resources for appropriate response, reaction, and questioning for all professionals working with children.

In 2010, legislation was enacted to support Child Advocacy Centers and the services that they provide for Maryland children and their families. The law states that money shall be provided in the annual State budget and shall be used to supplement, but not supplant, money that the programs receive from other sources. The law supports law enforcement, child protective services, social workers, and all who work to protect Maryland's vulnerable child victims of crime and abuse. (Md. Annotated Code, Criminal Procedure Art. § 11-923(h)).

FY 2016 Child Advocacy Center Funding in Maryland

In October, 2010, the Governor's Office of Crime Control & Prevention started its first year of funding to Child Advocacy Centers under the Child Advocacy Centers Assistance grant program. The partnerships formed in Child Advocacy Centers combine compassion for victims with a commitment to law enforcement, a vital participant and first responder in our overall effort to protect our children.

It should be noted that for the FY 2017 budget, Governor Hogan realigned the budget of the Governor's Office of Crime Control & Prevention to increase the funding to Child Advocacy Centers by \$50,000.

In FY 2016, twenty (20) Child Advocacy Centers and the Maryland Children's Alliance each received up to \$12,644 in funding. The total amount awarded was approximately \$250,000.00.


